



## Tips for Creating Traditional Posters

---

Scientific posters, regardless of format and aesthetics, need to be driven by a clear, concise message in order to deliver the greatest impact.

If you're short on time or budget to create a professionally printed large-format poster you can still develop an effective poster using 8 ½" x 11" sheets of paper and PowerPoint slides. Doing so gives you the added benefits of easily modifying your poster and carrying it on airplanes hassle-free!

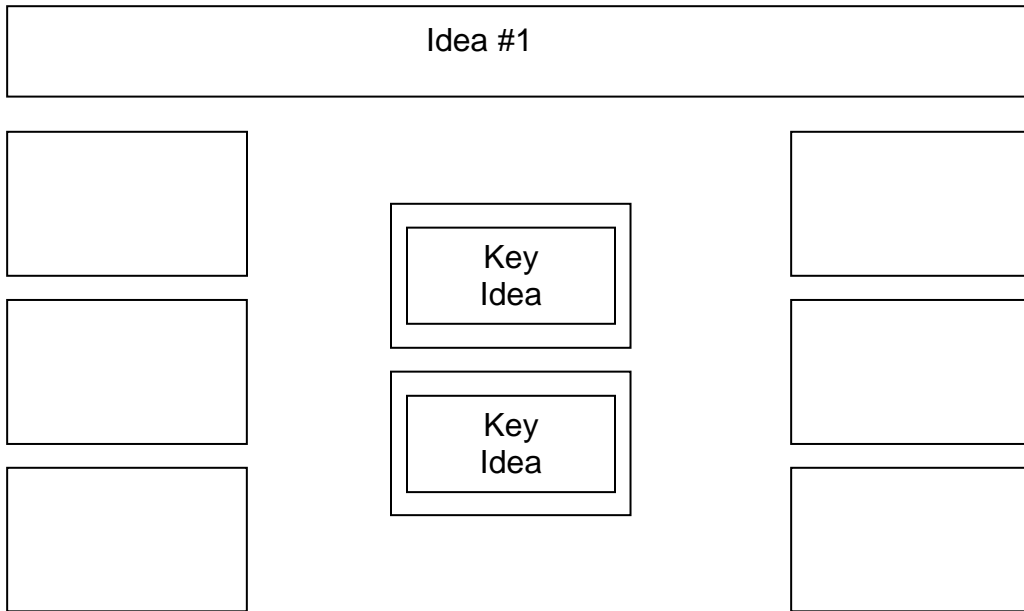
There are several tips for formatting an interesting and effective poster using good, old-fashioned copy paper:

1. **Use PowerPoint to create slides with a simple, consistent background for each sheet of paper.** Softer pastels and grays will generally work better as a background. You can also use different colored paper to create frames around the sheets you most want to emphasize/highlight.
2. **Use legal-sized paper or larger for the title of your poster.** Use a short, interesting, or catchy title with a big typeface, at least 108 pt. For example, "Swallowing A Bitter Pill: Tough Medication Management Issues Facing Nursing Homes" has more appeal than "High Risk Medications and Nursing Home Error."
3. **Try to have your main points toward the top of the poster,** also in big type (72 pt. +) to enable people to view "big picture" of your poster from a distance.
4. **Use headlines to differentiate different aspects of your poster:** We recommend that you use section headlines that further carry your message, although the traditional "Abstract," "Methods," "Data/Results," "Implications," "Conclusions," can also be used.
5. In general, **avoid typefaces below 20 pt.,** which are difficult to read from a distance of four feet or more. Try to use 24 pt at least.
6. **Justify the left margin, but not the right.** Justifying both margins makes the text harder to read and with bigger typefaces produces strange spacing between letters and words.
7. **Arrange the sheets creatively to draw viewers in.** Here are some ideas:

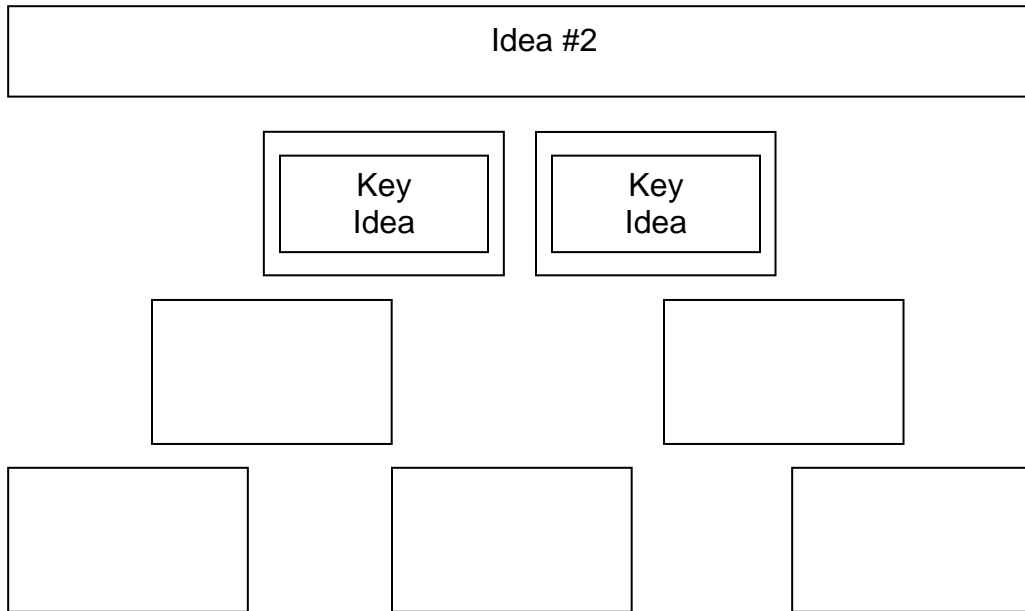

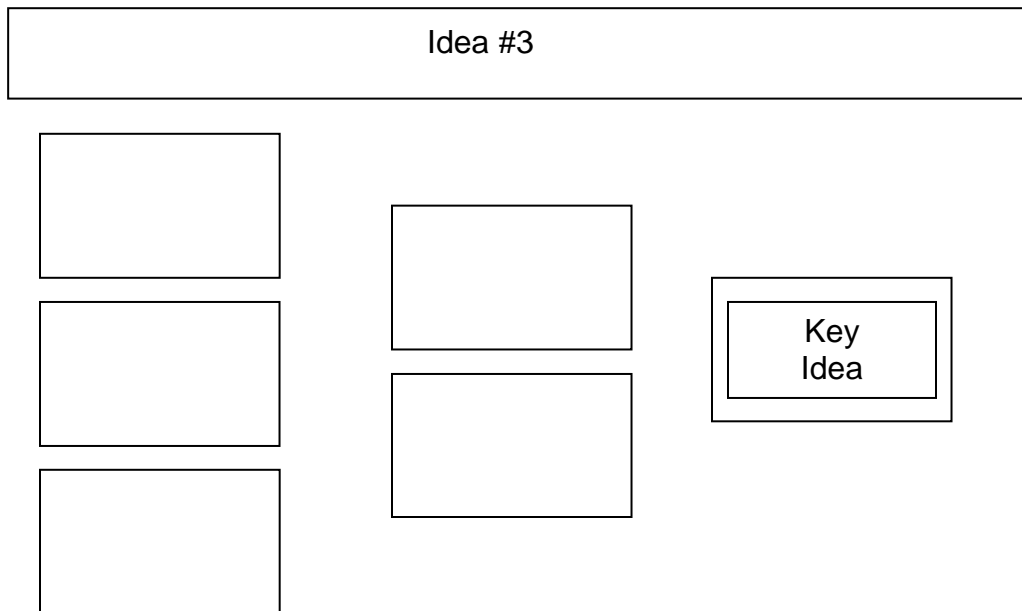

There is no extra credit for struggling when help is close by.
